Information on the Proposed Improvements to the Bayfront Parkway in the City of Erie Available Online

Oil City, PA – The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) announced today that the public can view online versions of the Bayfront Parkway Central Corridor improvement alternatives presented at the first of two public meetings in the City of Erie.

The proposed improvements include potential upgrades at the intersection of the Bayfront Parkway and Sassafras Street Extension, State Street, and Holland Street. Possible improvements are being considered to address pedestrian and bicyclists access along the roadway, as well as traffic congestion and connections between the waterfront and downtown Erie.

PennDOT's northwest region, which serves Crawford, Erie, Forest, Mercer, Venango, and Warren counties, is continuing to gather public input on the conceptual alternatives.
